Communion Presenters

The communion Presenters bring forward the gifts of bread and wine during the offering time.

Please sign in on the clipboard inside the ushers cabinet and let the ushers know that you are available to present communion. We have reinstated the sign-in procedure to help determine who will be presenting communion because there are often changes to the schedule that occur after the printing of the bulletin. If you are unable to assist when assigned please attempt to find your own substitute and notify the office of the change prior to Wednesday at 4 p.m. If you need assistance or find the replacements later than Wed. call Pam Mitchell, Shared Ministry Coordinator

As the offering time draws to a close, the Communion Presenters should retrieve the pitcher of wine and plate with the bread from the ushers' cabinet at the back of the sanctuary. The Communion Presenter on the left should carry the bread; the Presenter on the right should carry the wine. We bring these ordinary gifts, labors of our hands, to be blessed that they may be given back to us.

When the pastor and acolyte have received them, together with the offering, you will wait until the pastor indicates that the prayer is finished. You will turn and lead the procession back down the center aisle.

Communion Assistants

Communion Assistants help with the distribution of communion.

Please let the ushers know that you are present to assist with communion, because there are often changes to the schedule that occur after the printing of the bulletin. If you are unable to assist when assigned please attempt to find your own substitute and notify the office of the change prior to Wednesday at 4 p.m. If you need assistance or find the replacements later than Wed. call Pam Mitchell, Shared Ministry Coordinator.

Upon completion of the Offertory, the Communion Assistants should proceed to the hall closet for a robe and belt. Enter the chancel from the south entrance near the sacristy immediately after the Lord's Prayer. Proceed to the chancel platform in front of the altar table and face the Pastor at the altar table. You will be handed a tray of communion glasses. The pastors will distribute the bread, and the Communion Assistants follow with the wine. The Communion Assistants say, "This is the blood of Christ, shed for you." or "This is the true blood of Christ shed for you."

The communion recipient will select the wine or grape juice from the center of the tray. SOTH does not enforce any age restrictions in the receipt of communion it is up to each family to decide for themselves at what age their children may partake in communion. Careful attention should be given to make sure that there is grape juice available in the center of your tray. Please quickly step out of line and replenish the supply from another tray or take a new tray if the juice runs out prior to the wine.

When the congregation has finished communion, the Communion Assistants and pastors will take turns kneeling at the altar rail to be served communion. Following this, the altar area should be cleared by taking all the communion items to the sacristy. After the pastor has given the final communion blessing he or she will bring the remaining communion plate and goblet to you, or may motion for you to take the items from him or her.

Once the altar has been cleared to the sacristy, replace your robe in the hallway cabinet.

Greeters

When a person steps into a church for the first time, he or she evaluates the atmosphere. He asks himself: "Will they accept me? Will it be easy to make friends? Will my spiritual and personal needs be met? Will it be easy to find my way around? Will my family like it here?"

The newcomer will quickly come to some conclusions during the first few minutes. First impressions are often lasting impressions. Consequently, the ministry of the greeters is one of the most important things that happen at Shepherd of the Hills! **A Master Greeter loves People.** There is a love to meet people and make them feel important. It is the desire to put a smile on their face; the desire to help them have a good experience they will remember and want to return to. It is the desire to answer their questions, to make them feel comfortable and at home. It comes from a desire to share the love that Jesus has put in their heart. Although a greeter's love should be no stronger than is the love found in the rest of the body of Christ, nevertheless the greeter performs a major role in ensuring that people see and experience that love. In Christ, you have received God's unconditional love, and, in Christ, you are called to extend that same unconditional love to others. The ministry of greeting is perhaps one of the most crucial in the church because it is one of the most visible. It is a ministry vital to the saving work of the church.

Duties of the Greeter

Please arrive at church 35 minutes before the worship service you are assigned. Wear the Greeter nametag and meet with the other assigned greeters to determine door assignments. Staff the south entrance at the office entrance and the north and south narthex entrances. If you are unable to serve on your scheduled date please contact Pam Mitchell, Shared Ministry Coordinator.

1. Contact with newcomers. When you notice unknown guests, introduce yourself first, extend a welcome, and then ask for the visitors' names. While the visitors write in your guest book, call over pastor or usher and introduce them to the visitor. Introduce the visitors to this person who will show them to a seat or help them in finding Sunday school classes, the nursery, etc. It is especially important that you make a note of each visitor and turn this over to the pastor or shared ministry coordinator. This is an important source of new members when properly followed up.

2. Take an interest in people. We depend on the greeters to make Shepherd personal. If you really care about people, they will be able to see it. Some are shy and will want you to preserve their dignity by not being too forward. Others are gregarious and want to be asked questions. Try to sense needs such as those who are confused about the location of children's activities or need access to a rest room, etc. Be as helpful as you can. Invitations to activities. You may have an opportunity to let know they are invited to participate in upcoming events. Keep in mind the Wednesday night program, the meal the adult and children activities.

3. Listen for deeper needs. People come to church burdened with hurts, disappointments and personal crises. As you have opportunity, steer hurting people to those in the church family to whom they can turn for help—the pastor, parish nurse and perhaps the shared ministry coordinator. Use your knowledge to meet people at their points of need.

5. Distribute materials. Your task as a greeter has more to do with relationships than mechanical aspects like handing out materials. At the same time brochures are also important! We also have a special gift—a wrapped loaf of bread that is offered to our visitors.

Lectors

The major difference between “reading” and “proclamation” in liturgy involves the degree to which the person proclaiming a Scripture passage is personally involved with the passage.

By that we mean how much lectors are investing who they are, what they believe, and how they understand the passage into their effort to proclaim the message in the passage – in short, the significance the passage has for the lector, as a person of faith, is reflected in the way the lector “proclaims” the passage.

Many people with an interest in being a lector are intimidated by having to get up in front of the congregation to proclaim the Scriptures. When you consciously give yourself over to Jesus and the Holy Spirit to do as they see fit (not as you think is fitting) you realize very quickly that whatever your fears, most often they are self-imposed and have little or nothing to do with your efforts to proclaim the liturgy.

Duties of the Lector

Lectors read the lesson Sunday from the printed page that is provided by the church office. You will receive your reading several days prior to your scheduled date. The office will either send it via email or snail mail depending on your preference. The reading may also be taped to the office door on Sunday.

If you are unable to read on your scheduled date please attempt to find your own substitute and notify the church office by Wednesday at 4 p.m. so the bulletin can reflect the correct reader. If you need assistance finding a substitute or do so after Wednesday please contact Pam Mitchell, Shared Ministry Coordinator for assistance.

Lectors read from the lectern adjacent to the choir at the time designated in the bulletin and conclude the reading with the words, “Here ends the lesson.”

Lectors should be aware of the placement of the microphone and may need to adjust it so that it is possible to speak directly into the mouthpiece.

Ushers

The ministry of Ushering is a vital part of any church ministry. Ushers represent the church in a very visible way, and help set the tone in preparation for the worship service, as well as assist with the smooth operation within the service. It is your gift of ministry as an usher which helps make God's house ready for those who come to worship, and to establish an atmosphere of reverence. Ushers have a significant role to play in making people feel welcome and eager to return to hear the Word of God.

Even if detailed policies have not yet been worked out for emergency situations, ushers need to be ready at all times to respond as directed when there is a disturbance, illness, or other situation that requires special attention. There is a supply of water and orange juice in the usher cabinet if they are needed to assist a member or visitor that is in need. Also please familiarize yourself with the location of the phone in the narthex which is near the coat racks in case you would need to use it for emergencies. In general cell phones are not reliable inside the church facility.

The Schedule

The usher schedule is prepared by the head ushers; currently this is Matt Lilly and Red Pederson. The schedule is provided in this Worship Handbook which is mailed out quarterly. Additional usher assignments are required during lent, Holy Week and Christmas so please check all provided schedules for your assignments.

Team Captains

Team Captains are responsible for knowing their team's assignments and for having at least 4 or 5 ushers present at their assigned services. The team captains will call the team members prior to their next rotation to determine who is available and to remind them of their service dates. If the team requires more team members the Team Captains will notify the Shared Ministry Coordinator to arrange for new recruits. The Team Captains will train and orient the team members to the usher duties prior to ushering for the first time.

Usher Duties

Ushers should report at least 30 minutes prior to the start of the service.

Please acquaint yourself with your schedule and notify the Usher team captain if you are unable to usher at an assigned time so a replacement can be arranged.

The team captain should make sure all necessary and appropriate candles are available and burning for the worship service. This is especially important for baptisms and when acolytes are not present. The captain should see that six offering plates are in the usher cabinet at the back of the church.

Usher Duties Continued

Team captains will assign aisles and associated responsibilities. Each usher assigned an aisle will need bulletins for the service, as well as a few children's bulletins if available. There are large print bulletins available too.

Ushers will close the back doors of the church 5 minutes before the start of the service. Late comers may be asked to wait with the ushers to be seated during the opening hymn or announcements to avoid disruptions.

The balcony is reserved for choirs and or musicians, sound system operators and if necessary overflow seating.

Usher Tips

Know where the wash-rooms, phones, and nursery are.

Know where and what ministries are going on (Children Ministries, Youth, and Nursery).

Please avoid long conversations.

Have a nice smile.

Make folks feel welcome and wanted.

Give a firm handshake when you welcome.

Ushers need to be alert to worshippers who need assistance, such as an extra hymnal, or opening the door when leaving the church. Remember there is orange juice and water available in the usher cabinet if worshippers require it.

Ushers should do what is possible to discourage disturbances, i.e. noise from the lounge and hall areas and excessive noise from children walking in and out of church.

Additional Usher Responsibilities

Service At each service the captain is responsible for counting and recording the number of people present for worship. Remember to count the choir, loft, and altar areas. The sheet to record the count is located in the usher cabinet.

Offering The team captain will assign positions for receiving the offering. While taking the offering you should face the front of the church and move slowly backward toward the rear of the church keeping abreast of the other ushers if possible. Remember to collect the offering from the choir as well. Please note that in the case of special services the pastor may ask the ushers not to come forward with the offering. The usher captain is responsible for making sure all the elements are brought forward to the altar at the same time the offering is collected. The captain can have two ushers bring the offering forward behind the Communion Presenters for that service. The bread and wine is located in the usher cabinet. The Communion Presenter on the left should carry the

bread and the Communion Presenter on the right should carry the wine pitcher. In the event the Communion Presenters are absent the two additional ushers should present the wine and bread as well as the offering. Ushers should wait for the signal of the pastor before returning to the rear of the church by the center aisle walking behind the communion presenters.

Communion Two ushers are to be positioned in front of the pews, one on each side of the church and are to remain there to give assistance and direction to the communicants. When acolytes are present they will follow the Communion Assistants to collect the empty communion cups. When there are no acolytes at the service the empty cups will be placed on a table in the center aisle. One usher will be assigned the responsibility for removing the empty full trays of glasses. The full trays can be brought to the sacristy.

During communion communicants from one side of the church may be directed to proceed to the other side of the altar rail if space is available and is needed toward the end of the service. The usher's function during communion is not to hurry communion along, but it is rather to aid the communicant in making their presence at the Lord's Supper a meaningful and enjoyable experience.

Post Service After the service be friendly and helpful to worshippers leaving the church. Assist in putting the sanctuary in a neat and orderly state by removing bulletins and replacing hymnals in the pews. Straighten the pew cushions if necessary and remove the Happenings sheets from the offering plate and bring those to the church office. Return ushering materials needed for the next service to the usher cabinet. Check with your team captain regarding your next service date. Tape recordings of both services should be delivered to the church office. Following the 10:45 service or in the summer months the 9:30 service, turn off all lights in the sanctuary and narthex.

Black Hospitality Folders After the service only take out the "practice hospitality" pages from all the folders. Please turn them in on the desk in the main office.

The offering should be removed from the offering plats and handled by the head usher as he has been directed to secure it for safety reasons.
