

DREAMING TOGETHER

I was called to be the pastor of Calvary Lutheran – Edina in the summer of 2018. In the over 5 ½ years since then, so much has happened. The beautiful Calvary family, some 85 years from its founding as the first Protestant congregation in Edina, welcomed me in to share a hopeful vision of what we could do together in ministry in and from the southwest Edina neighborhood we called home. We got to know each other and began to study some things about our area. Then the COVID

pandemic arrived and, as with Shepherd and all other churches, we had to turn all our efforts into remaking congregational life in a changed world.

For all these years we continued a connection between Shepherd and Calvary that had begun in 2017 through Pastor Scott. Like in all relationships, there was some ebb and flow. Yet, we never ceased to support each other in mission and ministry. Out of that long standing connection a new process started to enfold in late 2022. The two church councils formed a team of Calvary and Shepherd members (Becky Rorke, Steve Manacek, Cindy Morris, Adam Driscoll, Bruce Nelson, Alyson Purdy, Pastors Sherri, Susan, Wade, Yolanda) to begin to explore more deeply how Calvary and Shepherd might join together. Calvary then made a difficult but faithful decision to sell its property and wrap up its 85 year history as a stand alone congregation. Part of its final decision-making process included developing a legacy fund to distribute proceeds from the property sale. The Calvary Legacy Fund ended up with over \$2,300,000 in proceeds and the congregation voted this past September on a plan to distribute those funds among some 30+ worthy organizations, locally, nationally and internationally.

At our annual meeting in January we heard a presentation from the Calvary/ Shepherd Team with some exciting news. From Calvary's Legacy Fund proceeds there will be at least \$300,000 in available funds to support new ministry initiatives housed at or from Shepherd of the Hills. This funding is intended to provide real resources for congregational ministry in our shared community of Edina/Hopkins. The plans will ultimately be approved by both the Calvary and Shepherd church councils, with the goal to consider ideas, research and evaluate them and approve them no later than October. After approval implementation can begin with no set deadline for completion and a hope that what we begin will become sustaining for years to come.

We want your ideas, your dreams and your hopes for what this new vision of shared ministry may look like in our community. During the last two worship services in February (the 18th and 25th) we will take some time to gather suggestions and ideas and then, following worship on Feb. 25, hold a listening session during the coffee hour after worship. Outside of worship there will be other ways to provide your input. We'll have a suggestion box on the Welcome Center, or you can always email the pastors or one of the Team members (reach out to a Pastor or Shawn for email addresses). Eventually we will do a survey of all members to help refine options and directions.

Dreaming Together continued

Here are some ministry areas that we hope can prompt your ideas, built around the four ministry areas that shape Shepherd's ministry today:

Serve: Ideas that would meet an identified need in our congregation/ neighborhood/community in the areas of housing, peacemaking, inclusion, justice, economic development and the like.

Care: Ideas for support and caregiving to members, neighbors, community in the realms of physical needs (food, clothing, health care), mental health, spiritual care, prayer support, visitation, companionship.

Learn: Ideas that would help educate people across the multigenerational spectrum, both in faith formation and practices but also in other areas that would support wholeness, healing, relationship building and fellowship.

Worship: Ideas that would support innovation and depth in worship life and practice for our membership but also for the sake of those who may seek a different mode, style or form of "church".

I'd anticipate a great many good ideas, and maybe a few "wild" ones. Our resources are solid but not unlimited. We hope the conversation can start wide and then narrow to ideas and proposals that show the best viability, impact and alignment with our core mission to *Love God and love neighbor in the Spirit of Jesus.* Or, to put it in Calvary's language, to *Welcome, worship and witness in Jesus' name.*

Please spend some time in thought and prayer about this wonderful opportunity. Then throughout this month we hope you will share your best ideas and dreams for what new thing God could be doing with and through us for the sake of God's love. **Pastor Wade**


WEDNESDAYS IN LENT Dinner church is back!!

LENTEN DEVOTIONAL BOOKS

"Gathered into One" provides daily devotions for each day from Ash Wednesday to the Resurrection of Our Lord/Vigil of Easter (traditionally known as Holy Saturday). Devotions begin with an evocative image and a brief passage from First Corinthians. The writers then bring their diverse voices and pastoral wisdom to the texts with quotations to ponder, reflections, and prayers.

Portions of First Corinthians appear in the Revised

Common Lectionary during each lectionary year. The apostle Paul writes this letter to the church in Corinth after hearing of quarreling and divisions among the people. He teaches the Corinthians that each person has a unique set of gifts from the Holy Spirit, given for the common good, and reminds them that the church is the body of Christ, joined together with one bread, one cup, one baptism, one God, and one Spirit. This theme of unity amid diversity is as timely now as it was when Paul wrote to the Corinthians.

During this journey through Lent to the Easter feast, may we celebrate the diversity among us as well our unity in Christ.
