

CALVARY / SHEPHERD TEAM UPDATE

From the Calvary-Shepherd Team we say Thank You! We received a bunch of responses to our recent invitation to "dream" about future ministries for our congregations – so many faithful, heartfelt and genuine ideas we shared and as a group we were gladdened by the Spirit's promptings in all the responses. The Team met mid-March to review and discuss all the responses and to begin to narrow the focus a bit, so that we could research additional information, develop some more detail, and work out ways to gather additional input.

First, we'd like to share some of our process. Our discernment has been guided by some parameters from the beginning. We know there are many worthy organizations in our community that deserve support and would benefit from additional financial resources. However, the intent of the Calvary Legacy Funds is not to make additional financial contributions (Calvary's Legacy Fund has already approved distribution of nearly \$2 million to over 25 groups). Rather, this portion of the Legacy Fund has been earmarked for new congregation-based ministry initiatives.

On that front we heard suggestions about youth programs and family ministry; about upgrades to sound and technology tools for worship; about the parish nurse position; about various areas of faith formation/education/community engagement such as creation care, gender justice, housing justice, violence prevention, skills training, evangelism, and mental health; and about alternative worship modes.

In considering those ideas we have kept a focus on our shared mission. At Calvary we talked in terms of "Worship, Welcome & Witness." At Shepherd we've used "Loving God and Loving Neighbor in the Spirit of Jesus" as our language. The Team has also looked for ideas that reflect innovation and that best respond faithfully to the situation of the church in the 21st century – a time of significant change from what church has been in prior generations.

From what we have received thus far, the Team is looking to focus on three areas for continuing study, conversation, and evaluation:

Youth Ministry Collaboration. What collaborative partnerships could we develop with other neighboring congregations to share and grow faith in the next generation? Three sister ELCA congregations in Richfield are doing new ministry under the name RALY (Richfield Area Lutheran Youth) – what can we learn from them? What are others doing to innovate outreach to youth in our community? Is there the opportunity to plan

events, mission trips, learning sessions or social gatherings that build robust faith and healthy relationships in young people of today?


"Dinner Church/Messy Church."

Shepherd has experimented the past two years with an intergenerational, casual dinner & worship gathering on Wednesdays in Lent. What could it look like to expand that experiment? Monthly dinner church or more often? Wednesday or Sunday evening or some other time? Music? Learning? Service Projects? Fun? Would doing "church" in a rather different way and at a different time meet a need, provide an outreach, and express Christ's love more deeply or effectively than what we currently do?

Technology & Communication. Should we leverage some of the available funds to bring our sound, video, and communications equipment to the next level to enhance Sunday worship, virtual worship, and other sanctuary gatherings? We want to consider costs, effectiveness and impact that can be obtained so that we all see, hear, and understand each other better. And so that all who come into our sanctuary experience God's Word of grace, love and hope as fully as possible.

Let's keep the conversation going. Let us know what you think. What questions do you have? What excites you about any of these ideas? What do you feel called to? Who should we be talking to?
