We ask that unimmunized members of the community wear masks for their protection and ours!




#### **CALL COMMITTEE UPDATE**

Greetings from the Call Committee!
We are so excited to report that the Holy Spirit has been busy calling the members of SOTH to fill out the congregational survey. We received nearly 100 responses between the online and paper copies. Thank you so much to all of you who took the time to share your input! We are busy compiling and analyzing the results and look forward to sharing more details with you soon.

Here is a preview of our next steps this fall:

- 1) We will use the survey results to shape the gifts and tasks sections of the ministry site profile (MSP).
- 2) We will review and finalize the MSP to submit to the Synod.
- 3) We will meet with Pastor Susan when she arrives.
- 4) We will host SOTH member meetings both in-person and on Zoom to get more thorough Congregational feedback.
- 5) We will plan a Congregational Listening Session with Bishop Anne Svennungsen after submitting the MSP to the Synod.
- 6) We will read and review candidate submitted resumes to decide on the candidates we would like to interview.

As we dive into fall and gear up for this incredibly meaty part of our journey, we ask you to pray that the Holy Spirit help and guide us on this journey to find SOTH's next senior pastor.
