## "The Promise of April Rain"

As I'm writing this it's pouring rain outside. Its grey and dreary and chilly - a day more suited for a fireplace, a cup, a book and a nap than just about anything else. This is a day made for a rest.

We do all need a day to be made like this every now and then – a day to cozy-up, circle around into ourselves, and ponder, relax, breathe and doze for a while. It would be my prayer that when God sends a day such as this, we could be free to do just that – to think, relax, breathe, or doze for a while. Most of us aren't really free that way – free to just take the day that comes and suit our living of it into what it is. Rather, we are bound by our schedules, our projects, our meetings, and our multiple responsibilities. Certainly all these things are important, all of them serve one good or another: creating the means to eat, be warm, protected and healthy; connecting with those important to us; growing up; learning; recreating. Our busy-ness serves us, and others, in many ways.

But our busy-ness also governs us, even restricts us. The command of the world is to focus, to produce, to fix and to act, and that command pulls us more and more outside ourselves and into the tasks at hand; more away from others and into the thing to be done. Our full-to-the-brim days perhaps take something apart in us. They disjoint us by narrowing us into only what we do. Yet, some part, a significant part, of us is our need to just be; our need to just ponder, relax, breathe or doze.

God is at work in days like today – though we have to trust it more than can see it at the time. The April rains promise results we trust to see soon enough: the green that bursts out after all the wet; the buds and blossoms that pop free, all showy and alive in colors fresh and fair; the aliveness that permeates air and earth, pond and river, bird and creature. God is at work in and under the dreary grey chill of days like today making a coming spring – for we know the result of that work when the sun breaks free in the days that come soon after days like this. The new breath that lifts life out of the grey chill and into vibrant warmth.

And God would be just as much at work in and under the grey chill of our sometime over-busy lives – should we take the moment, or the hour, or the day that sometimes presents itself, and circle around into ourselves to ponder, relax, breathe and doze a bit, amidst the dripping rains. God is, after all, as good at re-creating as he ever was at creating, as every spring proves. I pray God soon gives each of you such a day – a day to just be, and to be re-created.

May 2 - 4, 2024

Like the early Christians gathered at Pentecost, we pray for the Spirit to fill us with "glad and generous hearts" as we gather for our 2024 Synod Assembly.

## HOLDEN VILLAGE INTEREST MEETING Sunday, April 21st after worship


